The Domestic Violence Center of Howard County is a non-profit agency offering innovative and comprehensive services to victims of domestic violence. The Clinical Department invites applications for the position of Adult/Child Therapist. This is a full time position, 40 hours per week. The DVC offers competitive pay and a full benefits package, including health & dental insurance, paid vacation and sick leave, and 403(b).

Job Summary: Provide individual and group therapy to clients impacted by domestic violence and/or sexual assault.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Conduct individual and group counseling sessions according to individualized treatment plans and in accordance with professional standards.
- Develop a specific goal-oriented package of treatment, skill development, and supportive services for each client. Make treatment/social service referrals to appropriate agencies in order to affect a positive impact on a client's performance.
- Create, maintain, and submit accurate records and documents on a timely basis and in an appropriate manner.
- Communicate information to appropriate agency staff to ensure follow through of treatment.
- Provide crisis intervention through helpline and crisis walk-in appointments.
- Maintain current knowledge of assessment and treatment techniques, criminal justice systems, and community resources using in-service training, seminars, workshops, and publications.
- Participate in planning and delivery of community education and other agency projects.
- Meet regularly with supervisor and fulfill educational requirements.
- Work at least two evenings per week.
- Assist with other administrative duties as required.

Qualifications: Must have graduated from an accredited Master's Program in Psychology, Social Work, or a related field and possess a Maryland State License. Knowledge of clinical diagnostic methods and principles and various modalities of psychotherapy and counseling required. Must also possess basic computer skills and ability to communicate effectively both verbally and in writing. Prior experience working with victims of trauma preferred. Bilingual skills a plus.
